Growing Great Readers



We have analysed the impact of the 'Growing Great Readers' reading incentive and are thrilled to report that we have seen an overall increase in the number of reads per week, a reduction in the number of children not reading at all and an increase in those reading 'frequently' (6 or 7 times per week). Therefore, we have set the children a challenging goal of 500 reads in each class this term to keep the momentum going and we are focusing on those children who are

not yet reading regularly at home (i.e. less than 3 times per week). Please be encouraged by the following:

- 'Reading at home' does mean your child has to read a whole book or chapter: just 5
 minutes of reading a day is a great start!
- Your child's reading will not be counted if it is not recorded in their diary. They can
 write the date and name of the book in themselves
- If you need some help in supporting your child with their 'decoding' skills (reading the
 words), then our website has lots of help and advice for parents and carers, including
 videos demonstrating how to pronounce each of the sounds: https://www.watermoorprimary-dgat.org.uk/phonicsandearlyreading
